Who can attend this event? Anyone can attend — veteran or new Catholic home educating parent, those discerning home educating, those encouraging and supporting Catholic home education. This conference supports all teaching-styles, learning-styles, or Catholic curriculum options. Parents typically attend this event from throughout Pennsylvania and the northeast United States.

Will I be able to take my curriculum home? Yes. Because of the vast array of vendors invited, families

who supplement or organize their own curriculum could find virtually all of their materials at this one event AND save on shipping charges. Even the fullservice curriculum providers will have large quantities of individual books available.

NOTE: Due to pre-testing requirements and space limitations in transport, families choosing to use the full-service curriculum providers will not be able to take home their entire curriculum. However, discussion with them and reviewing their materials in person will be most invaluable, and supplemental items may be purchased at this time.

Can we trust the choices of materials available to choose from? You can feel confident that the Vendor Committee works year round to carefully select vendors who are providing materials and/or lesson plans that are loyal to the Holy Father and Catholic Church teaching. However, some vendors carry other popular items such as math, phonics programs, and many other supplemental materials as well.
